Basic principles of reviewing papers for **Landform Analysis**

1. Each paper is subjected to a review by at least two independent reviewers from outside the Editorial Board.
2. In the case of texts submitted in English, at least one of the reviewers is affiliated with an institution in a country other than that of the paper's author.
3. The author(s) and the reviewers do not know one another's identities (the so-called double-blind review process).
4. In other cases the reviewer signs a statement of no conflict of interest. A conflict of interest is taken to arise if the following types of relation hold between the reviewer and the author:
 - a. direct personal relations (kinship, legal bonds, a conflict),
 - b. the superior-subordinate relationship,
 - c. direct scholarly cooperation within the last two years preceding the writing of the review.
5. The review takes a written form and ends in a clear recommendation of a paper for publication or rejection.
6. The review form is available to the public on the journal's website.
7. The names of the reviewers of individual publications /volumes are not disclosed; once a year or in given volume the journal makes the list of cooperating reviewers public.
